What do we believe about how children learn?

Vygotsky defined learning as " the creation of meaning that occurs when an individual links new knowledge with existing knowledge"

The PYP beliefs about learning is clearly in line with the constructivist approach. Teachers find out

- what children already know
- plan learning experiences through the curriculum and the environment that give students opportunities to test and revise their models/ideas
- and allow students to make connections between their previous and current perceptions.
- Structured inquiry enables teachers to make connections between what students know and how they learn.
