

International Baccalaureate Programmes: Longer Term Outcomes

A qualitative study investigating the influence of International Baccalaureate programmes on the lives of alumni

Researchers from the Melbourne Graduate School of Education at The University of Melbourne are exploring the longer-term outcomes of participation in an International Baccalaureate (IB) programme. The study is seeking the views of IB alumni who participated in an IB programme from the late 1960s up to the 2010s, from any geographical location and school type.

As an IB alumni, you are invited to participate in a short, online survey about what you view as the impact of the IB experience on various aspects of your life and your overall outlook, including your personal values, worldview and career choices. It is anticipated that the survey will take approximately 10-15 minutes to complete.
